Reception

What a busy and exciting term we have had in Reception. The children have been so engaged in our topic 'New Life' and have enjoyed learning about plants; planting different vegetables and fruits including strawberries, radishes, lettuces and courgettes. We look forward to them being ready soon! The children have also been learning about where our food comes from and had a very exciting trip to Rushall Farm where we saw different farm animals, took part in pond dipping, went on a bumpy trailer ride and learned a lot about the natural world. This term we also had class caterpillars where we observed the lifecycle and the metamorphosis process.

This term the children had 3 extra physical development sessions with Jake from Just Play Sports. The children thoroughly enjoyed these, playing lots of team games and learning new skills.



We have had another very busy half term! Our theme this term has been The Secret Garden, we have learnt lots about the weather and plants, we planted our own flowering plants in our school grounds and we have done some excellent writing inspired by 'Jack and the Beanstalk'!

On Tuesday this week, we had a wonderful DT day where the children designed and made delicious fruit kebabs! Thank you so much parents for the fruit donations.

We also can't forget our memorable school Coronation Day with our very own school King and Queen!





















We've been becoming a lot more knowledgeable about Wokingham this term, and also the growing process of plants. We've also been developing our independence, resilience and team-building skills with a walking trip into town and an overnight stay at Oakwood Centre. Our year 6 reading buddies helped us to use the VR headsets to explore San Francisco.









Year 3 have been so busy learning all about Reading, the UK's largest town! We had a wonderful trip to the town, on the train, to do some geography field work and visit the museum and Abbey ruins. The children learnt about the Huntley and Palmers biscuit factory, before designing and baking their own biscuits. They were very impressed by the replica of the Bayeux tapestry (which is actually an embroidery) and have been inspired to create their own embroidery designs. Everyone enjoyed celebrating the coronation of King Charles and Queen Camilla. The children wrote some excellent speeches to the people of Reading, as if they were the king, using formal language and a celebratory tone!

This term's science has been all about plants. We have been investigating in more detail what plants need to grow and be healthy, role playing different modes of seed dispersal and the favourite, modelling the pollination using Wotsits! Look out for our peas in the planters.















And of course, congratulations to our Primary Engineers!





This half term, Year 4 has been learning all about the Romans, how they adapted in Britain and why they wanted to invade. We also went to Butser Farm where we learnt about what the Celts thought about the Romans and what the Romans thought of the Celts. Then we did something called testudo which is a tortoise like formation out of Roman shields.

The children have developed their teamwork skills, independence and resilience and will no doubt be excited to tell their families all about their week!
















This term has been a busy one for Year 6! We enjoyed breakfast (Some yummy toast!!) and games to set us up for SATs, which we took in our stride...


In Art, we have been creating our own cityscapes, using patterns and textures found around school!


In Science, we have been conducting experiments about shadows and testing whether different light sources affect shadows.

Car Park and Parking

Unfortunately we have had yet more complaints about parking from our neighbours who are experiencing difficult situations with Evendons parents parking inconsiderately.

Wokingham Borough Council is sending traffic enforcement officers to help with this situation.

Our relationship with the community is important to us and we request that parents walk, cycle or scoot where possible and avoid blocking driveways or parking on corners.

As a reminder - the car park is for STAFF USE ONLY AT ALL TIMES. We do not have the resources to patrol the car park during After School Club pick up or Breakfast Club drop off times and we rely upon our parent community to adhere to this request.

School Drop Off

We encourage all children to go in to their classrooms independently. Therefore, parents should drop off their children at the designated exterior doors for their classes. Please do not attempt to drop off or collect from the internal classroom doors.

Please refrain from taking your child in to their classrooms as this is disruptive to the morning activities that teachers have prepared for the day and is also contrary to the school's safeguarding and security procedures.

If you are dropping your child to school outside of normal times returning from an appointment or late after the gate closes - it is extremely important that you bring your child to the office so that they can be signed in.

If you do not do this, we will not have a record that your child is on the premises.

School Fund Donations

At Evendons we deliver high quality education and pride ourselves to offer a rich and wide-ranging programme of extra-curricular activities to all children, even those who may otherwise not be able to have this opportunity outside the school environment.

Our school budget is rigorously managed by Bellevue Place Educational Trust, which carefully administers expenditure and helps us to find the most cost effective suppliers. However, as a result of increasing costs and reduced funding for all schools, it is becoming increasingly difficult to finance the items we wish to provide the school in order to enrich our children's learning environment. Such items are outdoor play apparatus, IT equipment, funds for school-held events, displays and play resources.

We have set up a School Fund via Scopay in order to offer a way to parents who wish to offer a donation. Contributions would finance the provision of additional resources and equipment which may not be available through our usual government funding.

How the funds will be spent will be a shared decision between the Headteacher in collaboration with our pupils and the LAB. **Donations will not be used to fund staffing or any resources that should normally be funded via the school budget**.

This is entirely voluntary, of course. We know that many families are experiencing the devastating impact of the rising cost of living and rocketing fuel bills. However, if you are in a position to make a donation, please log into Scopay (link - www.scopay.com/login) and select the "School Fund Donation" option. You may choose to issue a one-off payment or make any number of donations at any time.

Please be advised there is no pressure on parents to contribute, and regardless of whether you are in a position to donate to the fund or not, we remain ever grateful for your support.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

We want to ensure we are providing your child with the best education and support possible. Healthy school food has obvious benefits, can help pupils establish healthy habits for life and also help to improve pupils' readiness to learn.



Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for Free School Meals. Registering for free meals could also raise extra funds through Pupil Premium. This currently equates to:

- £1,455 for your child's primary school;
- £1035 for your child's secondary school; to fund valuable support such as trips, additional support or other school activities.

We encourage families who are in receipt of benefits **across all year groups** to apply for benefits-related Free School Meals. Note: this is separate to *Universal Infant Free School Meals*, which is the provision of free lunches for all children in Reception to Year 2. Your child may qualify for free meals for the duration of their Primary years. It takes less than two minutes to apply!
